Please contact the Lodge for details Eligibility: Be at least 16 years old * live outside the Greater Toronto Area (Toronto, Mississauga, Brampton, Richmond Hill, Vaughan, Markham) * be referred to the lodge by a member of your health care team * be able to manage your own personal care and medications * be able to attend appointments at the hospital independently * be able to walk up and down at least one flight of stairs without assistance * be receiving active cancer treatment such as radiation therapy, chemotherapy, or stem cell transplant

Family bedrooms are similar to a hotel room in design and are equipped with a queen size bed, a single bed and a trundle as well as a full ensuite bathroom. Each room has a fridge, storage and linens to

Common spaces include a family lounge, communal kitchen and recreation space Fees: Room rate is \$15 per family, per night Eligibility: Live a minimum distance of 55 km away from the House * Have a referral from a hospital social worker, and complete an application form * Adults and overnight guests must complete a criminal background check as part of the admissions process * Anyone suffering from, or who has recently been exposed to, a communicable illness cannot be admitted (including family members with a cold or the flu)

This is a monthly program that works directly with the patient's social worker. Work with patient and family to complete the application and to include the additional documentation needed. Patients must be currently receiving active treatment to qualify, A maximum of \$1,000 may be approved per family, per year
