The ADP also helps cover the cost of specialized supplies, such as those used with ostomies To qualify, the person must be an Ontario resident, have a valid Ontario health card, and have a disability requiring the equipment or supplies for six months or longer. A persons income is not considered ADP covers 75% of the cost of the equipment and supplies and ADP is billed directly for this amount by the supplier. The balance 25% has to be paid by the buyer. Equipment and supplies are to be purchased from an approved ADP vendor only. Get examined by an occupational therapist or physiotherapist registered with the ADP. Contact ADP to get a list of OTs or PTs covering the area you live in. Provide assistance specifically to children and youth with long-term physical disabilities for essential equipment and fully accessible camping and recreation programs. To qualify the child should be under the age of 19 years, a legal resident of Ontario, and has a long-term physical disability that restricts independent mobility and has an impact on performing daily living activities. The child must be using a mobility device such as a walker or wheelchair to be mobile

Provide financial assistance of up to \$3 000 per year, per child to help purchase essential mobility equipment such as wheelchair, walkers, ramps or lifts
