The Peel Outreach team is a responsive, mobile, multi-disciplinary team that meets people where they are at, people who are homeless or who feel they may become homeless. The team works in partnership with community agencies to provide support, advocacy and referrals to help people with their basic needs. The team includes: Mental Health Support Staff, Substance Use Harm Reduction Staff, Family Transitional Outreach Staff, Ontario Works in Peel Caseworkers, Housing Support Worker. Referral and advocacy is available for: Housing, Emergency shelter, Employment, Mental health and addictions supports.

Preventing Homelessness in Peel Program (PHIPP) 905-793-9200 - PHIPP provides one-time financial assistance for utility arrears and/or mortgage or rental arrears to eligible residents who need help securing or maintaining affordable accommodation. In some situations, PHIPP will also assist with landlord-tenant mediation to prevent eviction. The Preventing Homelessness in Peel Program helps Region of Peel residents who: Intend to continue living in Peel, Are under threat of eviction, or are currently homeless or residing in a temporary shelter, Have exhausted all options for financial and housing supports, including friends and family, Are not eligible for assistance under the Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Support Programs, Are not eligible to receive more appropriate assistance from any other agency, Do not require PHIPP services as a result of a labour dispute, Ontario Works completes a needs test for all PHIPP applicants, therefore, an application for Ontario Works must be completed before a referral to PHIPP is made.

Provide safe, secure short-term housing for a maximum of one year for up to twenty families who have been staying in emergency shelters or without appropriate housing. Families will have an opportunity to obtain resources and develop skills that will enable them to integrate into the community and sustain independence Supports include: employment services, educational training, housing, budget counselling, parenting classes, anger management, life skills training, and counselling, healing garden and psycho-social education. Children also attend programs and recreational activities including: a homework club, case management and special outings to community events and field trips

Clients are required to demonstrate a reasonable level of stabilization in their recovery journey as well as a readiness to live a substance-free lifestyle. Referrals may come from service providers or from self-referrals.

There are 48 private rooms, organized into "houses" which consist of four one-bedroom units that feature shared bathrooms, kitchens and lounge The residential program involves both individual and group work on life skills. Programs include, but are not limited to: budgeting, effective communication, conflict resolution, goal setting, time management, healthy relationships/sexuality, cooking and nutrition, body image and self-esteem, art and recreation. The objective is to assist residents in attaining the life skills required to live and thrive independently within the community Eligibility: In need of housing but not in immediate crisis * must have a sustainable source of income or be eligible for income assistance * must be in school or working or wanting to engage in work or school full-time * willing to actively participate in programming (i.e. personal goal setting, workshops, chores) Fees: Residential Program: Rent \$335/mth

Youth ages 16-21 are eligible to participate in the transitional program, length of stay is up to 3 months, and extensions may be approved for longer stays. Youth participate in a comprehensive case management program, with mandatory programs to assist them in developing all Aspects of their life. May be asked to pay rent based upon their income.</p> <p>There are 6 beds in the Transitional Program. Youth within the program share a room with one other resident, is a co-operative living environment and all residents within the program will participate in various chores.</p>

It is designed with 60 units which can accommodate up to 225 people. The program operates 24 hours a day on a year-round basis. The facility is owned and operated by the Region of Peel, while the Salvation Army manages the daily programming and staffing. The Salvation Army and Region of Peel staff help homeless persons by: fostering well-being, providing shelter, food and clothing, helping families locate affordable housing, supporting families in their transition to independent living, providing effective connections with community agencies, providing support to seek and secure employment.

The facility is owned and operated by the Region of Peel, while the Salvation Army manages the daily programming and staffing. The Salvation Army and Region of Peel staff help homeless persons by: fostering well-being, providing shelter, food and clothing, helping families locate affordable housing, supporting families in their transition to independent living, providing effective connections with community agencies, providing support to seek and secure employment.
